The MBA UNDH: a contribution from the Diaspora

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ORIGIN of the idea of a MBA school in Haiti

- In January 1995, I became the executive director of UCG at the office of the PM of Haiti
- Mission was to take charge of short term infrastructure repairs after 3 years of embargo and the return of constitutional order
- Small IDB financing at first (PURE 1), then augmented (PURE 2), and followed by WB financing also (Work creation)
- Was able to observe directly systemic managerial shortcomings in many spheres of economic activities: the public sector; the banking sector; the firms engaged in public Works; the marketing of public Works contracts; the accounting system; the imbedded corruption; the strange absence of MBA training in a country aspiring to growth and development.
- So I knew what I would do, when I could

The contributors to its creation

- The UNDH in Gonaives and the Chancellor's office in Port au Prince
- A childhood friend who became an important M.D. in Miami
- My family
- Various Universities in Puerto Rico, notably UPR, IAU and PUCPR
- Fordham University in New York as requested by UNDH Chancellor
- The BRH
- Unibank, Sogebank, Capital bank, Digicel
- Local Ph.D holders and Business professors in the Caribbean region
- Operations started in 2017 in the presence of Fordham Provost

Results (1)

- Well received
- Over 100 applicants in the 12 months. Had to start a second promotion ahead of schedule
- Not just accountants, marketers, economists
- Students included engineers, agronomists, doctors, nurses, data specialists, priests, lawyers, public sector managers
- By now (2024) over 350 sollicitants; 250 enrolled; 170 graduated
- 140 graduated with double degree from IAU of Puerto Rico
- According to a survey of graduates in february 2023, 80% were working in Haiti
- By then, the few who had migrated were well placed in enterprises in the US and Canada or in international organizations

Results (2)

- Please note the survey was conducted in february 2023, just before the great political upheaval
- 98% of graduates say they are satisfied or very satisfied with what they learned during the program
- Over 50% reported increases in income and work responsibilities
- 70% of students were males and 30% females
- 60% work at local private enterprises, 20% in the public sector; 10% in the agricultural sector, 10% in ONG and int'l organizations
- About 5 persons have gone on to doctoral programs outside Haiti and doing very well

Results (3)

- Students see the Program as of high quality
- They appreciate that learning is based on understanding and not repeating from memory
- They believe they have increased their decision making capacity
- They value the leadership training
- They have increased their salary
- They have obtained more job responsabilities
- By survey time, the very great majority worked in Haiti (80%)

Challenges and Perspectives (1)

- Pandemics made us go on line or hybrid
- Then came the security situation resulting from the 4 simultaneous crisis(economic, fiscal, dollar, political), so we went fully on line
- But we attend now only half of installed capacity. We can easily admit 25 more students per promotion
- We can admit also from the diáspora, since the double degree from IAU is accredited in the US
- Tuition is much lower than comparable training programs in the US
- Courses are given during evenings from 5 to 8.00pm and on saturdays. Classes can be attended from home
- Professors have doctorate degrees from US, Canada, China and Europe
- Soon, we will start a program of short training courses
- We also intend to increase research activities and start a MPA program
- We are ready to increase the level of activities, as soon as the country becomes more secure.

Challenges and Perspectives (2)

- You can also choose to help finance qualified family members.
- Regional diáspora organizations can invest in qualified potential regional leaders in places with internet Access in Haiti
- .This would be a strong backing to local development
- . Change will not come without the development of different localities all over the country
